

Singer called health hazard

MELBOURNE, Australia (UPI) — Victoria State Health Minister Alan Scanlan complained that singer David Cassidy "must be viewed as a health hazard" in view of what happened at a concert at a Cricket stadium.

Scanlan reacted after a report on the concert by the Public Health Commission which said 300 teen-agers fainted and another 50 were injured in the crowd of 30,000.

The commission's report said no similar performance should be held at the Cricket grounds without precautions being taken.

"In such conditions as existed at his performance at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on Sunday, David Cassidy must be viewed as a health hazard," Scanlan said.
