Cassidy back

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — Singer David Cassidy will share the spotlight with former "Partridge Family" co-star Danny Bonaduce this weekend as Cassidy kicks off his Kansas action first U.S. tour in 15 years.

Bonaduce will open Saturday's show in Hershey, Pa., with a comedy routine based on his recent runin with the law, Cassidy's publicist, Steve Levesque, said.

Bonaduce, 31, was sentenced to three years probation last month in Phoenix for attacking a transvestite prostitute.

The tour is Cassidy's first since he scored a top 20 hit last year with the single "Lying to Myself" from his self-titled album.

Plans for a 1990 tour fell through when his record company went out of business.
