

MGM's EFX loses leading man, bronco riders arrive

avid Cassidy is leaving a blockbuster show and the bull riders are arriving. There's certainly a lot happening in this entertainment mecca. Here's my view.

After a successful two-year run during which he was named Las Vegas' best singer as well as the city's best all around entertainer -Cassidy has announced that he will leave the "EFX" show at the MGM in December.

Cassidy will leave the \$45 million stage production at the end of the year to pursue other projects, including promoting his recently released adult contemporary, "Old Trick, New Dog." He also wants to remain a Las Vegas resident.

While the MGM isn't releasing who will take over the star position in "EFX," a story has appeared in a local newspaper indicating Broadway superstar Tommy Tune may fill in for an eight-month run. Tune still wants to

return to Broadway for a delayed revival of "Easter Parade," with co-star Sandy Duncan.

The tap sensation "TAP DOGS" will hold its last performance at the Stratosphere Tower on Oct. 25. The critically acclaimed dance production is currently in discussion with several hotels to relocate the show elsewhere in Las Vegas. The Images Cabaret where "TAP DOGS" has been holding its shows is going to be turned into a sports book.

Once the 1998 Bud Light Cup Tour reaches Las Vegas, it will have traveled to 22 different cities nationwide.
