

## OLD SAD SONG

Too-familiar tale
of David Cassidy
wears thin as NBC
tells it one more time

Memo to David Cassidy: I think you bore me. I woke up annoyed this morning. I won't meet you halfway.

In short, cherish is not a word I'd use to describe all the feelings I have for *The David Cassidy Story*.

The Cassidy movie, premiering at 9 p.m. Sunday on NBC, comes on the heels of numerous other chronicles of the former *Partridge Family* star, including his own 1994 memoir, two VH1 *Behind the Music* productions (one on Cassidy

himself, the other on the Partridge Family) and an E! documentary.

There was also
Come On Get
Happy, a TVmovie, which aired
last November on
ABC, based on
Partridge Family
co-star Danny
Bonaduce's
memories of the
show.

In sum, the new movie is on highly familiar ground. Too familiar, in fact, especially for those of us
