That show was "The Partridge Family," broadcast on ABC from 1970 to 1974. The series, about a fatherless

family of six who forms a rock band and tours the country in a psychedelically painted school bus, never drew blockbuster ratings, but was a huge hit with young viewers and others who found it entertaining Cassidy played Keith, Jones

was the mom, Susan Dey played Laurie, and Bonaduce was red-haired muffin Danny Partridge. "It caught people's imagina-

tion," Cassidy reflected. "Here was this family bonding over music Yes, there was bickering and conflict, but for people who were in unhappy homes, they really identified with the show."

Cassidy's career soared to spectacular levels, and although his onginal fans grew older over the decades, he continued to headline concerts and work in theater and TV. Now he seems to be coming full circle.

"I've turned down an awful

lot of money to do a network reunion special in the past," he said. "This new show is not that. This is a scripted show with a new cast. We'll be looking for talent — not just
